## Tightening Loose Spikes and Hangers

Over time, the expansion and contraction of metal and wood cause the spikes (the long nails holding the gutter) to work themselves loose. You might see the heads of these spikes protruding from the gutter face. When a spike is loose, the gutter pulls away from the fascia, allowing water to run behind it. This not only rots the wood but also causes the gutter to sag. A professional repair involves removing these old spikes and replacing them with modern, threaded hidden hangers. These screws bite deep into the wood and refuse to let go, pulling the gutter back tight against the house and restoring its structural strength.

## Resealing Leaking End Caps and Miters

The end caps (the pieces that close off the gutter run) and miters (corner pieces) are sealed with a special caulk. Over years of UV exposure, this caulk dries out and cracks, leading to drips. A drip at a corner might seem harmless, but it often lands directly on the foundation or splashes onto the siding. Re-sealing these joints requires scraping away all the old, failed sealant, cleaning the metal down to bare aluminum, and applying a high-performance architectural sealant. It is a precise job; simply smearing new caulk over old dirty caulk will fail in weeks. Doing it right stops the leak permanently.

## **Re-attaching Loose Downspouts**

Downspouts are held to the side of the house with straps. If a strap comes loose or breaks, the downspout can wobble in the wind. Eventually, this movement will disconnect the downspout from the gutter outlet above, leaving a gaping hole where water pours out uncontrollably. Securing downspouts is a quick repair that restores the integrity of the system. It ensures that water is actually making it to the ground and away from the foundation, rather than splashing against the brick or siding halfway down the wall.

## **Fixing Minor Pitch Issues**

Sometimes a gutter looks fine but holds standing water. This means the pitch (the angle) is off. Standing water is heavy and corrosive. Adjusting the pitch doesn't always require replacing the gutter. Often, a technician can adjust the hangers to slightly raise one end or lower the other, restoring the flow. This simple adjustment prevents water from freezing in the gutter during winter and prevents mosquitoes from breeding in the summer. It is a subtle tweak that makes a massive difference in performance.
